What is a Virtual Machine?

A **Virtual Machine** is a computer emulation that behaves as a regular computer. It can have specific software installed, and has access to the Columbus State network, intranet, and network drives.

VMware Horizon View is an application for your computer, tablet, or even phone that allows you to connect to a Virtual Machine.


When using a Virtual Machine, make sure you save your data to cloud or network storage so it does not get lost. If you save your data locally to the virtual machine, it may be gone the next time you log in.

Set up VMware Horizon View on your Mac Computer



Install VMware Horizon View

- 1. Open a web browser and browse to https://mypc.cscc.edu
- Select Install VMware Horizon Client to download the Horizon Client for Mac



- 3. After downloading the file, execute the installer by double clicking the dmg
- 4. Accept the License Agreement by clicking Agree



 In the VMware Horizon Client window that opens, drag the VMware Horizon View Client icon to the Applications Folder icon. This will copy the Client into your Applications folder

To Install VMware Horizon Client, drag the icon to the Applications folder.



Connect to the Virtual Machine


- 1. Open the VMware Horizon Client
- 2. Verify that the Connection Server shown is **mypc.cscc.edu**, then double click and proceed to step 3

If it is not listed


- a. Double click Add Server
- b. Enter mypc.cscc.edu for the name of the Connection Server
- c. Click Connect



3. When prompted enter your **username** (not email address) and **password** and click **Login**Domain should be CSCC and does not need to be changed



4. After logging into the Client, you will be presented with a list of Virtual Machines to which you can connect




It is important to select the correct machine to ensure you have access to your software and data.

- 6. For **standard software** availability select
 - a. For employees: **CSCC Employee Remote Access Note:** before employees have access, they need supervisor approval in a request sent to the IT Support Center (help@cscc.edu)
 - b. For students: Virtual Computer Commons
- 7. After you connect to the Virtual Machine, if prompted, enter your username and password to login to Windows

Disconnect from the Virtual Machine

To disconnect from a Virtual Machine, simply Sign out, like you would on a normal lab computer.

- 1. Click the Start Menu
- 2. Click on the user icon ()
- 3. Click Sign out



Once you have downloaded the VMware Horizon Client icon onto your computer, you should see: mypc.cscc.edu icon > double click to get the Login > enter Password > click on Integrated Media Virtual Machine > this will take you to the CSCC desktop (you may need to enter in your username and password again) > once you are in you should be able to open the Adobe software.

After clicking on whichever Adobe software you will using, you get a pop-up window asking you to Sign In > enter in CSCC username and password > Select Account: Company or School Account > pop-up window Connecting to fs.cscc.edu (you will again be asked to enter in their username & password) > click OK

This does not mean that they have the Adobe software on their computers. This is a way from them to use the CSCC software as if they were in one of our labs down on campus.
