### "Colorful Characters of the Ohio Frontier" Presented by Gary S. Williams

Mondays, July 7, 14, 21, 28 - 10:00 a.m. - Noon  
Center for Workforce Development (WD), 4<sup>th</sup> Floor

**About the Course:** Return with us to the thrilling days of yesteryear when the Ohio country was contested by the French, British, Spanish, and of course the Native Americans who already lived there. The struggle to make Ohio the first state settled by free Americans was waged by some of the most colorful characters in American history. Eight assorted heroes and villains involved in this tumultuous era will be profiled:

**Week One:** John Gibson and Simon Girty--the contrast between a hero and a villain whose lives were intertwined.

**Week Two:** Anne Bailey and Abraham Whipple--important contributions made by a woman and a senior citizen.

**Week Three:** William Wells and James Wilkinson---a pair of traitorous scoundrels.

**Week Four:** Lewis Wetzel and Tecumseh--the contrast of two controversial figures on opposite sides.

**About the Presenter:** Gary S. Williams is a lifelong Ohioan whose first job was on the archaeological excavation of Fort Laurens, Ohio's only Revolutionary War fort. He has a B. A. in History from Marietta College, a Master's in Library Science from Kent State University, and twenty-five years experience as a librarian. Gary returns by popular request, following his LLI course on early Ohio in July 2007, which was based on his four books on early Ohio History, which will be available again at this year's classes.

### "Journeys to Places of Import and Intrigue" Presented by M. Eugene Gilliom

Tuesdays, July 8, 15, 22, 29 - 10:00 a.m. - Noon  
Center for Workforce Development (WD), 4<sup>th</sup> Floor

**About the Course:** This series of slide-based talks will take participants to far-flung places of importance and intrigue. The impact of globalization and change will be among themes pursued in the series.

**Week 1:** The Changing Face of China: This session will focus on the change Gene Gilliom has witnessed in China during the eighteen trips he has taken to the PRC since 1975. Particular focus will be given to economic, social, educational, and political changes.

Lifelong Learning Institute of CSCC provides educational opportunities for mature learners in Central Ohio to broaden and extend their knowledge, share their life experiences, become more attuned to community resources, and interact socially with other "lifelong learners." The Institute offers a year-round menu of courses, "Coffee and Conversation" events and symposia in partnership with several Central Ohio locations, including senior residence facilities and arts organizations.

**Week 2:** Voyage to India: A Land of Beauty., Fascination and Color: This session will present a far-ranging exploration of this increasingly significant and fascinating country. Among the highlights: a visit to the Taj Mahal, sunrise on the Ganges River, ascending to the Amber Fort on elephants in Jaipur, and hunting for elusive tigers in Ranthambohre National Park.

**Week 3:** Exploring Russia via the Waterways of the Czars: This session will profile life in Russia today and will explore changes that have occurred over the past thirty-six years. Through slides and sound, participants will navigate the 800-mile waterways from Moscow to St. Petersburg, with fascinating stops and shore excursions along the way.

**Week 4:** The Magic of Ecuador and the Galapagos Islands: This session will focus on mainland Ecuador before journeying to the fabled Galapagos Islands, made famous by Charles Darwin in 1835. While exploring the "enchanted islands," attention will be given to the native wildlife, history, geography, and flora of the Galapagos.

**About the Presenter:** Gene Gilliom is a Professor Emeritus in Social Studies and Global Education at The Ohio State University. He founded the Social Studies Education Program Abroad in 1969, and since then has led a total of seventy-three student and faculty groups abroad to a total of thirty-eight different countries. During his trips abroad, Gene has photographed extensively the people and countries he has visited. He attempts to capture not only the physical beauty of host countries, but also the uniqueness of the cultures of their people.

## "Sport in Popular Culture: Cinema" Presented by Zachary Richardson, Ph.D.

Wednesdays, July 9, 16, 23, 30 - 10:00 a.m. - Noon  
Center for Workforce Development (WD), 4<sup>th</sup> Floor

**About the Course:** We will examine the representation of sport in one of the most common mass media forms: popular film. The film medium will be read as a text in its larger social contexts---e.g. considerations of race/ethnicity, class, gender, and sexuality. As we examine films that range in age and genre we will also consider what, if anything, constitutes a "sports film," as well as weigh the ramifications of this question.

**About the Presenter:** Zac Richardson earned his B.A. in History at the University of Illinois at Chicago, and an M.A. in Sport Humanities at Ohio State, where he is also currently working toward his PhD (which will include a specialization in Film Studies, and dissertation work on sport cinema). He will also draw on his experience writing for and performing on stage and screen, for an overall unique and valuable combination of perspectives in his teaching.

## "The Entire History of Classical Music - The Condensed Version" Presented by Kimberlee Goodman, Ph.D.

Thursdays, July 10, 17, 24, 31 - 10 a.m. - Noon  
Center for Workforce Development (WD), 4<sup>th</sup> Floor

**About the Course:** This fun and innovative course will offer an overview of the four eras of classical music: Baroque, Classical, Romantic, and 20th Century/Post-Tonal. Each class will include listening examples. The last class will include a flute and piano recital with works from each of the eras of music.

**Week 1:** Baroque Era (1685-1750) example: J. S. Bach

**Week 2:** Classical Era (1750-1825) example: W. A. Mozart

**Week 3:** Romantic Era (1825-1910) example: Johannes Brahms

**Week 4:** 20th Century and Post/Tonal Era (1910-present) example: Leonard Bernstein

**About the Presenter:** Kimberlee Goodman holds the Doctor of Musical Arts and Master of Music degrees in flute performance from The Ohio State University. She is a native of Arizona and received her Bachelor of Music degree from Arizona State University. Dr. Goodman has been on the faculty of Otterbein College since 2005. She has performed in Ireland, Thailand, and throughout the United States. In August, 2008 Dr. Goodman will perform and present at the national flute Association's annual convention in Kansas City, Missouri.

## "The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn: the First Truly American Novel" Presented by Barbara Thompson

Fridays, July 11, 18, 25, August 1 - 10 a.m. - Noon  
Center for Workforce Development (WD), 4<sup>th</sup> Floor

**About the Course:** Participants will revisit an American classic, Mark Twain's *Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*. Discussion will focus on the novel's importance in the canon of American literature by examining such aspects as character, language, setting, point of view, tone, etc. The novel was controversial in its time, and remains a challenge in certain circles today. Participants should read or review the novel to facilitate discussion. Paperback copies of the Dover Thrift Edition (unabridged) of the novel are available for \$2.00 at the new Columbus State Community College bookstore, the next building south of the Workforce Development building, where LLI classes meet.

**About the Presenter:** Barbara Thompson is Professor of Communication Skills at Columbus State Community College. She holds a B. A. in English Language and Literature from Boston College (specialization in 19th Century American Literature) and an M. A. in English from The Ohio State University. She has been an instructor at Columbus State since 1977, and has taught several courses which include 19th Century American Literature.
