



ERC Quick Guide: Searching LexisNexis (pre-2010)

www.csc.edu/library > Research Databases

Use **LexisNexis** to find articles published in **newspapers** from around the region, around the country, or around the world. Find **transcripts of news programs** originally broadcast on radio or television. **Refine searches** based on publication type or topic. Search **specific date ranges**, or search **individual publications** (for example, you can search for articles only published in the *New York Times*, the *Columbus Dispatch*, etc.)

Click the “Sources” tab to choose specific sources, such as Ohio newspapers.

From the **Search** screen, enter your **keywords** in the Search terms box. For advanced search options, select the **Power Search** link.

Select the **publication types** to be searched here. “Major U.S. and World Publications” will be searched by default.

Indicate the dates you’d like to search here. Search a **specific date**, before or after a certain date, or provide a **date range**, such as the example above.
