Trever Murphy Memorial Foundation Announces Memorial Scholarship Fund
Scholarship to benefit students studying in the Fire & EMS fields

COLUMBUS, OH: Today, the Trever Murphy Memorial Foundation announces the establishment of a memorial scholarship to benefit individuals who aspire to follow in the footsteps of Firefighter/Paramedic Trever Murphy and serve their communities as firefighters and EMS providers. Trever was known not only as a compassionate provider but as a caring and understanding leader, mentor, and instructor. This scholarship will serve as a way to honor his legacy in Fire & EMS education for generations of Firefighters and Emergency Medical Technicians to come.

The first scholarship application period is officially open for a Fall, 2020 scholarship disbursement. The amount of the first scholarship shall be a one-time benefit of \$500; Funds may be used for the payment of tuition, books, and/or materials required for class. Applicants must be initial education Ohio Firefighter Level 1, Level 2, and/or EMT students at an approved institution of higher education.
