Career:

The rapidly growing field of Finance has a wide range of readily-available career opportunities such as investments, corporate finance, banking, international finance, insurance and financial planning. These careers may be in finance departments of corporations or government agencies, or various departments of banks, savings and loans, mortgage companies, and insurance companies. Positions titles include loan processor, financial planner, loan officer, financial analyst, customer service analyst, mortgage banking trainee, credit analyst, insurance analyst, and stockbroker trainee.

Transfer:

The Finance A.A.S. can transfer to the Financial Management B.S., Financial Planning B.S., and Risk Management and Insurance B.S. degrees at Franklin University. While Ohio State University does not accept all CSCC business (accounting, finance) courses as transfer credit, CSCC has various articulation agreements other universities including Otterbein, Capital University, Ohio University, and Miami University.
