



Supply Chain Management International Commerce Certificate 2018–2019

DESCRIPTION:

Supply Chain Management (SCM) Certificate students will gain an in-depth understanding of SCM Principles in the areas of transportation and traffic management, strategic procurement, warehouse management, inventory management, international shipping, and import/export regulations.

Courses for these certificates follow the guidelines and cover the content established by the Council of Supply Chain Management Professions (CSCMP), the Institute for Supply Management (ISM) and The North American Small Business International Trade Educators (NASBITE) in their certification exams. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Students must complete SCM 1100 - Supply Chain Management Principles or show equivalent industry knowledge to begin this certificate program.

ONGOING REQUIREMENTS:

Students must maintain minimum overall GPA required by the College.

Career:

This certificate will greatly enhance a student's SCM credentials or may serve as a platform to gain employment in the SCM industry. As SCM is a field in high demand across all types of industries, particularly in the Central Ohio region, employers will be able to see the value of this certification. Non-degree seeking students as well as Associate Degree candidates may pursue this valuable credential.
