



Pharmacy Technician Certificate

2018–2019

DESCRIPTION:

The Pharmacy Technician Program is an entry-level certificate program that prepares students with the knowledge and skills necessary for a career as a pharmacy technician. Students will learn how to prepare medications for dispensing, perform dosage calculations, adhere to state and federal regulations, provide excellent customer service skills, take inventory, and order supplies all while being exposed to real-world situations pharmacy facilities are faced with day to day. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

The following items are prerequisites to the pharmacy program and are recorded/tracked elsewhere in Columbus State systems or in multi-skilled health department records: a background check and drug screen must be completed in order to register for MULT 1500.

ONGOING REQUIREMENTS:

Students must maintain minimum overall GPA required by the College.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR GRADUATES:

Career:

Students are qualified to perform pharmacy-related functions and provide pharmaceutical care services under the supervision of a licensed pharmacist. In addition, students can sit for the national Pharmacy Technician Certification Examination, as administered by the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board (PTCB) and must obtain licensure to work.

Transfer:

The course work for this program can be applied toward the AAS degree in Multi-Skilled Health.
