



# Phlebotomy Certificate

## 2018–2019

### **DESCRIPTION:**

The Phlebotomy Certificate Program is a NAACLS approved program that prepares students with entry-level skills to perform blood collections within a health care setting. Students will be exposed to a clinical experience where students will complete a minimum of 100 clinical hours and 100 venipunctures. Students who complete this program will receive a certificate of completion and be eligible to take the certification exam through the American Society of Clinical Pathology (ASCP). ### **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:**

The following items are prerequisites to the phlebotomy program and are recorded/tracked elsewhere in Columbus State systems or in multi-skilled health department records: a current health record must be on file in the health records office by the first day of class; a background check and drug screen must be completed in order to register for MULT 1950 and 1910.

### **ONGOING REQUIREMENTS:**

Students may be required to update their health record.

### **OPPORTUNITIES FOR GRADUATES:**

#### **Career:**

Upon completion of certificate students are qualified to obtain employment within a doctor's office or hospital setting; In addition, students can take a certification exam through the American Society of Clinical Pathology which would provide an industry credential.

#### **Transfer:**

The course work for this program can be applied toward the AAS degree in Multi-Skilled Health.
