



Social and Human Services Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) 2018–2019

DESCRIPTION:

The Social and Human Services A.A.S. degree program prepares students with the knowledge and skills to support individuals with diverse needs in a variety of settings. Students in this program are prepared to provide support to persons in difficult life situations, persons with developmental disabilities, emotional/social/environmental concerns, mental health disorders, and substance use disorders as well as individuals who have co-occurring disorders. The five semester program includes 315 hours of hands-on experience under the direct supervision of professionals in local and adjacent county agencies. For more information, see csc.edu/sahs.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Students must place out of DEV coursework and must place into ENGL 1100. Students must attend a program Information Session, and meet with a HHS Division advisor to establish initial plan of study.

ONGOING REQUIREMENTS:

Students must complete the background check process. Students must complete a program acceptance packet and interview. Students must demonstrate adherence to the Social and Human Services A.A.S. degree program's Professional Expectations and Code of Conduct. Students are encouraged to verify summer term financial aid eligibility and meet with a division advisor to discuss transfer implications for general education course selections. Students must maintain a 2.5 GPA.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR GRADUATES:

Career:

Graduates work throughout the spectrum of social and human services professions in a variety of positions and settings. Graduates are eligible to apply for the Social Work Assistant with the Ohio Counselor, Social Worker, Marriage and Family Therapist Board and meet the addictions-related course content for the Chemical Dependency License with the Ohio Chemical Dependency Professionals Board.

Transfer:

The most common degrees for transfer are the Bachelor of Social Work, Bachelor of Science in Social Work, and Bachelor of Science in Substance Abuse Counseling. Students are encouraged to meet with an advisor from the preferred transfer destination to ensure optimum transferability of courses.
