



Supply Chain Management International Commerce Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.)

2018–2019

DESCRIPTION:

As the eighth largest exporting state in the U.S., Ohio values international commerce. The Supply Chain Management International Commerce A.A.S. degree program is designed to respond to the need for an educated workforce at all levels of the career ladder. Grounded in supply chain management (SCM) fundamentals with courses in transportation management, inventory management, transportation rates and claims, international shipping, international commerce, etc., this major also includes a three-semester language sequence in Spanish or Chinese as well as supplemental courses in global marketing, business culture, and economics to broaden and deepen students' understanding of the complexities of international commerce. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

This is a non-selective, open-admission program; students may start in any semester.

ONGOING REQUIREMENTS:

OPPORTUNITIES FOR GRADUATES:

Career:

The Columbus region is a hub for logistics, particularly international shipping and commerce. The top 15 logistics companies in the Greater Columbus Metropolitan Area employ over 32,000 people. Columbus area exports have grown 74% (an increase of almost \$4 billion) since 2006, and in 2016, Columbus was the 48th largest exporter in the United States. Currently, more than 450 foreign-owned firms employ over 54,000 people. Some of the finest logistics companies in the world have a presence in the Rickenbacker Inland Port area, the United States' only cargo-dedicated airport and the only "Free Trade Zone" with customs clearance in the state of Ohio. Major exports include chemicals, transportation equipment, plastics and rubber products, computer and electronic products, machinery, apparel and accessories, processed foods, electrical equipment, appliances, and agricultural products.

International Commerce majors may expect entry-level positions with customs brokers, freight forwarders, and cargo and freight agents as well as entry-level, first-line management positions as leads, supervisors, and managers in distribution centers, warehouses, and regional and national headquarters in areas such as warehousing, distribution, import/export, purchasing, material management and control, inventory management, traffic and transportation, and operations management.
