





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## Columbus State wins award for boosting student success, reducing gaps




The rate of students graduating within three years has nearly tripled after the community college implemented programs that provide greater intervention and mentoring for those at risk of falling behind.

In 2010, David Harrison was just settling into his new position as Columbus State Community College president. Amid the effects of the Great Recession, Harrison and a handful of board members attended a workshop centered on student success, drilling into student data many hadn't studied before.

The numbers weren't pretty. The college's three-year graduation rate hovered at just 8 percent. Only 33 percent of students were graduating or transferring. There were troubling success gaps between white and minority students, as well as between students who qualified for need-based aid and those who didn't.


# Completion rates increasing, gaps closing



Gaps have narrowed for low-income students and students of color.



# A \$1.3 trillion national epidemic

- “Housing bubble” comparisons
- Most students (70%) borrow
- Average per borrower: \$37,000
- Average time to pay off: 21 years
- ★ 76% of Columbus State Students take on zero loan debt.

# Debt Delays Lives

 Delayed independence (40% of grads move in with family)

 Delayed home ownership (71% delay buying due to debt)

 Delayed family (56% wait due to debt)

 Delayed retirement savings (50% delay due to debt)

- Career-focused degree programs: low cost, high demand
- Transfer programs: save nearly half off a bachelor's degree
- ★ 76% of Columbus State Students take on zero loan debt.


## Program Overview

- This year, College Credit Plus students come from 149 middle and high schools throughout Central Ohio


# Top 5 Course by Enrollment 2018-19


