- **CSCC General Education Requirements:** Students should choose the General Education courses for the AA degree in consultation with their academic and faculty advisors.
- **CSCC Degree Plan:** This Sample Graduation Plan was created with the assumption that students would complete the AA Geography transfer pathway before transferring into the stated bachelor's degree. Completing the general Associate of Arts degree is also an option and this document can still be used for degree planning. If you have questions, contact a Columbus State Arts and Sciences Academic Advisor and an advisor at The Ohio State University
- **AA Degree and Ohio Transfer 36:** Students who complete the AA degree at Columbus State earn the Ohio Transfer 36 (formerly the Ohio Transfer Module). OSU requires students to complete the Ohio Transfer 36 and/or the AA degree to

fulfill the OSU General Education Foundation and Open Choice Theme requirements for the OSU degree. **If a student does not complete the AA degree and/or the Ohio Transfer 36, they will need to take additional general education course work at OSU to earn the degree.**

- **OSU General Education Requirements:** How a student completes these requirements will vary, depending on how they chose to complete the General Education requirements at Columbus State. Any General Education requirements not completed at Columbus State will need to be completed at Ohio State. Students may be required to take a specialized “Bookend” seminar for transfer students at OSU even if they have completed the AA degree and the OT-36. Elective course work, if selected appropriately, can be used to pursue a minor and/or second major. Students should consult with an academic advisor in the department of the intended major to discuss optimal course selections for General Education, effective choice of electives, and appropriate course selections in the major.
- The Bachelor of Science in City and Regional Planning requires 120 semester credit hours and a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher to earn the degree.
- **\*\*BS CRP Major Notes:** Students apply to OSU and declare City and Regional Planning as their chosen major. Major admission requires a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher. ECON 2200 is required for major at OSU. Major Theme credit hours would be waived based on GEOG 2750: World Regional Geography, GEOG 2400: Economic and Social Geography and GEOG 2900: Elements of Cartography being considered thematically relevant to the BSCR. These courses are required for the AA/AS in Geography at Columbus State. CRP 3150: Digital Design and Analysis for Planners at OSU would be waived since AA/AS Geography students are required to take GEOG 1100: Introduction to GIS at Columbus State. The CRP major does not require completion of a foreign language. Students may use their AA electives here to start a minor or second major course work to be completed at OSU. Any questions regarding course selections for the CRP major electives, second major, or minor courses should be directed to the departmental advisors at OSU.

### **Suggested Courses to Complete for OSU’s General Education Requirement and Requirements for the Associate of Arts Degree at Columbus State**

#### **Intermediate Composition**

*For the AA degree and the OT-36, students must complete one course from ENGL 2367, 2467, 2567, 2667, or 2767.*

#### **Historical Study**

*For the AA degree and the OT-36, students must complete one Historical Study course. Any course from the list on the AA Geography major plan of study can be chosen for this requirement.*

#### **Literature/Cultures & Ideas/Visual & Performing Arts**

*For the AA degree and the OT-36, students must complete one course from Literature/Cultures & Ideas/Visual and Performing Arts. Any course listed in these categories from the AA Geography major plan of study may be chosen.*

#### **OT-36 Exploration**

*To earn the AA degree and the OT-36, Students must complete at least two additional courses from Social Science (not GEOG), Literature/Cultures and Ideas/Visual and Performing Arts, and Historical Study categories on the AA Geography major plan of study.*
