- **CSCC General Education Requirements:** Students should choose the General Education courses for the AA degree in consultation with their academic and faculty advisors.
- **CSCC Degree Plan:** This Sample Graduation Plan was created using the general plan of study for the Columbus State Associate of Arts degree. Students who are following a specific transfer pathway at Columbus State may utilize this plan for the purposes of transfer and degree planning but should note that additional course work may be necessary to complete the Columbus State Associate of Arts transfer pathway beyond what is required for the Bachelor of Science in City and Regional Planning degree at The Ohio State University. Additional course work completed as part of a Columbus State transfer pathway may be applied as electives or where appropriate, course work toward the major/minor at OSU.
- **AA Degree and Ohio Transfer 36:** Students who complete the AA degree at Columbus State earn the Ohio Transfer 36 (formerly the Ohio Transfer Module). OSU requires students to complete the Ohio Transfer 36 and/or the AA degree to fulfill the OSU General Education Foundation and Open Choice Theme requirements for the OSU degree. **If a student does not complete the AA degree and/or the Ohio Transfer 36, they will need to take additional general education course work at OSU to earn the degree.**
- **OSU General Education Requirements:** How a student completes these requirements will vary, depending on how they chose to complete the General Education requirements at Columbus State. Any General Education requirements not completed at Columbus State will need to be completed at Ohio State. Students may be required to take a specialized “Bookend” seminar for transfer students at OSU even if they have completed the AA degree and the OT-36. Elective course work, if selected appropriately, can be used to pursue a minor and/or second major. Students should consult with an academic advisor in the department of the intended major to discuss optimal course selections for General Education, effective choice of electives, and appropriate course selections in the major.
- The Bachelor of Science in City and Regional Planning requires 120 semester credit hours and a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher to earn the degree.
- ****BS CRP Major Notes:** Students apply to OSU and declare City and Regional Planning as their chosen major. Major admission requires a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher. ECON 2200 is required for major at OSU. Major Theme credit hours could be waived based on course work completed at Columbus State if that is evaluated as being considered thematically relevant to the BSCR. Students may use their AA Elective course work to exercise this option. Please see your academic advisor at OSU for more information regarding this option. These courses are required for the AA/AS in Geography at Columbus State. The CRP major does not require completion of a foreign language. Any questions regarding course selections for the CSCC or CRP electives should be directed to the departmental advisors at OSU.

Suggested Courses to Complete for OSU’s General Education Requirement and Requirements for the Associate of Arts Degree at Columbus State

Intermediate Composition

For the AA degree and the OT-36, students must complete one course from ENGL 2367, 2467, 2567, 2667, or 2767.

Historical Study

For the AA degree and the OT-36, students must complete one Historical Study course. Any course from the list on the AA plan of study can be chosen for this requirement.

Social Science

For the AA degree and the OT-36, students must complete two Social Science courses from two different departments. ECON 2200 is required for the major at OSU. Students should select a second course from a department other than ECON from the AA plan of study for this requirement

Literature/Cultures & Ideas/Visual & Performing Arts

For the AA degree and the OT-36, students must complete one course from Literature/Cultures & Ideas/Visual and Performing Arts. Any course listed in these categories from the AA plan of study may be chosen.

OT-36 Exploration

To earn the AA degree and the OT-36, Students must complete at least three additional courses from Social Science, Literature/Cultures and Ideas/Visual and Performing Arts, and Historical Study categories on the AA plan of study.
