- **OSU General Education Requirements:** How a student completes these requirements will vary, depending on how he or she chooses to complete the General Education requirements at Columbus State. Any General Education requirements not completed at Columbus State will need to be completed at Ohio State. Students with questions prior to admission to the College of Education and Human Ecology should consult an advisor in 100 PAES Building
- **CSCC Degree Requirements:** This Sample Graduation Plan was created using the general plan of study for the Associate of Arts/Science degree. Students who are following a specific transfer pathway may utilize this plan for the purposes of transfer and degree planning, but should note that additional course work may be necessary to complete the Columbus State Associate of Arts/Science Transfer Pathway beyond what is required by Bachelor of Science in Hospitality Management degree at The Ohio State University. Additional course work may be applied as electives or where appropriate, course work toward the major/minor at The Ohio State University.
- **AA Degree and Ohio Transfer 36:** Students who complete the AA degree at Columbus State earn the Ohio Transfer 36 (formerly the Ohio Transfer Module). OSU requires students to complete the Ohio Transfer 36 and/or the AA degree to fulfill the OSU General Education Foundations, and Open Choice Theme requirements for the OSU degree. **If a student does not complete the AA degree and/or the Ohio Transfer 36, they will need to take additional general education course work at OSU to earn the degree.**
- All Bachelors' degree programs in the College of Education and Human Ecology require a minimum of 120 semester hours, a 2.0 GPA in both the major and cumulative GPA and 30 credit hours of residency.
- Course availability is not guaranteed for the term courses are shown in this plan. Time to degree could potentially be affected by an inability to register for courses as listed.
- ****Hospitality Management Major:** Students must apply and be accepted to The Ohio State University and indicate Hospitality Management on your university application as the desired major. Transfer students admitted to OSU may enroll directly into the HM major. Any student in good standing at OSU can change their major into HM. Students must earn a grade of "C" or higher in HOSP 1101 for the course to apply to your major. Students may choose to minor in business. If students choose to minor in business, they may complete the following CSCC courses in place of AA electives: ACCT 1211 and 1212. Students seeking this minor must also complete ECON 2200 as one of their Social Science courses and MATH 1130 or 1146/1148 instead of MATH 1122/1123 here at CSCC. More course work will be required for this minor at OSU and may add additional time toward the degree.

AAS HOSP Note: Students who have earned an AAS in Hospitality Management at CSCC do not need to pursue the AA. Students with this degree are eligible to take a different degree option for the BS Hospitality Management degree at OSU ("Option B") that uses their course work from the AAS degree for the majority of their major requirements. Since these students will not earn the OT-36, they should see an OSU academic advisor about taking other courses to count for the GE Foundations.

HOSP 1101: Intro to Hospitality Management: See your academic advisor (Aquinas Hall 116) to have this course petitioned to count as an applied elective to the Associate of Arts degree. This course is equivalent to CSHSPMG 2600: Intro to Hospitality Management at OSU, a required course in the HM major.

Suggested Courses to Complete for OSU's General Education Requirement (new -2022) and Requirements for the Associate of Arts Degree at Columbus State

Intermediate Composition

For the AA degree and the OT-36, students must complete one course from ENGL 2367, 2467, 2567, 2667, or 2767.

Historical Study

For the AA degree and the OT-36, students must complete one Historical Study course. Any course from the list on the AA plan of study can be chosen for this requirement

Social Science

For the AA degree and the OT-36, two social science courses are required from two different departments. These courses must be chosen from different departments listed on the AA plan of study.

Natural Science

For the AA degree and the OT-36, students must take two science courses. At least one course must have a lab. OSU requires at least one laboratory course. The second science course may be a lab or a non-lab course and may be selected from the list on the AA Plan of Study.

Literature/Cultures & Ideas/Visual & Performing Arts

For the AA degree and the OT-36, students must complete one course from Literature/Cultures & Ideas/Visual and Performing Arts. Any course listed in these categories from the AA plan of study may be chosen.

OT-36 Exploration

To earn the AA degree and the OT-36, Students must complete at least three additional courses from Social Science, Literature/Cultures and Ideas/Visual and Performing Arts, and Historical Study categories on the AA plan of study.
