The department will purchase 25 cameras, and train 33 Police Department personnel to record and store video data. The College will involve internal and external stakeholders through policy development and communications, and will evaluate the program and consider adjustments following the 7-month program introduction. The main goal is to improve the ability to monitor activity and respond to incidents, ultimately reducing/preventing complaints against officers and reducing the amount of time spent in court.

Shared Law Enforcement Training Services Feasibility Study**

The proposed feasibility study will address these issues directly by undertaking a shared law enforcement training services project that will assess whether local law enforcement agencies and an educational institution can collaborate to provide high quality training more cost effectively. The study will assess the feasibility of using a common learning management system (LMS), BlueQuill, for the development, delivery assessment, tracking, and reporting of agency training. The shared services collaboration will develop and deliver law enforcement training in the most effective manner. The project will minimize the cost by leveraging the best educational technology and the resources and expertise of the participants to provide standardized training that meets the unique needs of each agency and community. The agencies and organizations participating in the study are as follows:

Deliverables:

1. Creating at least two online and two hybrid in-service courses developed collaboratively that will be delivered to all officers employed by the participating agencies. The specific courses to be developed will be determined collaboratively by the study participants during the development phase, but could include a search and seizure course, diversity course, or a mental health course.
2. Creating at least three courses developed independently by personnel at the participating law enforcement agencies. Select personnel in the participating agencies will be trained on how to utilize the BlueQuill Learning Management System to build and deliver their own content online. This will demonstrate the ability of different agencies to independently develop and share content on the system.
- Deploying the statewide Supervisor Training and Education Program (STEP) using BlueQuill. This will demonstrate the ability to integrate current training programs into the shared services collaboration.
