**Overview.** The primary purpose of the Logistics Engineering Technician (LET) project funded by the National Science Foundation is to develop a career pathway. A key component of effectively implementing this career pathway involves recruiting participants to LET. To understand the factors impacting on students' decisions to choose a particular major as well as to gather baseline data of self-efficacy, a survey was disseminated to students enrolled in logistics courses in Fall 2015. The survey asks questions regarding student intention to pursue LET, why they are interested in the particular pathway, and overall self-efficacy regarding completing LET related courses. The self-efficacy questions are based on the STEM self-efficacy questionnaire.

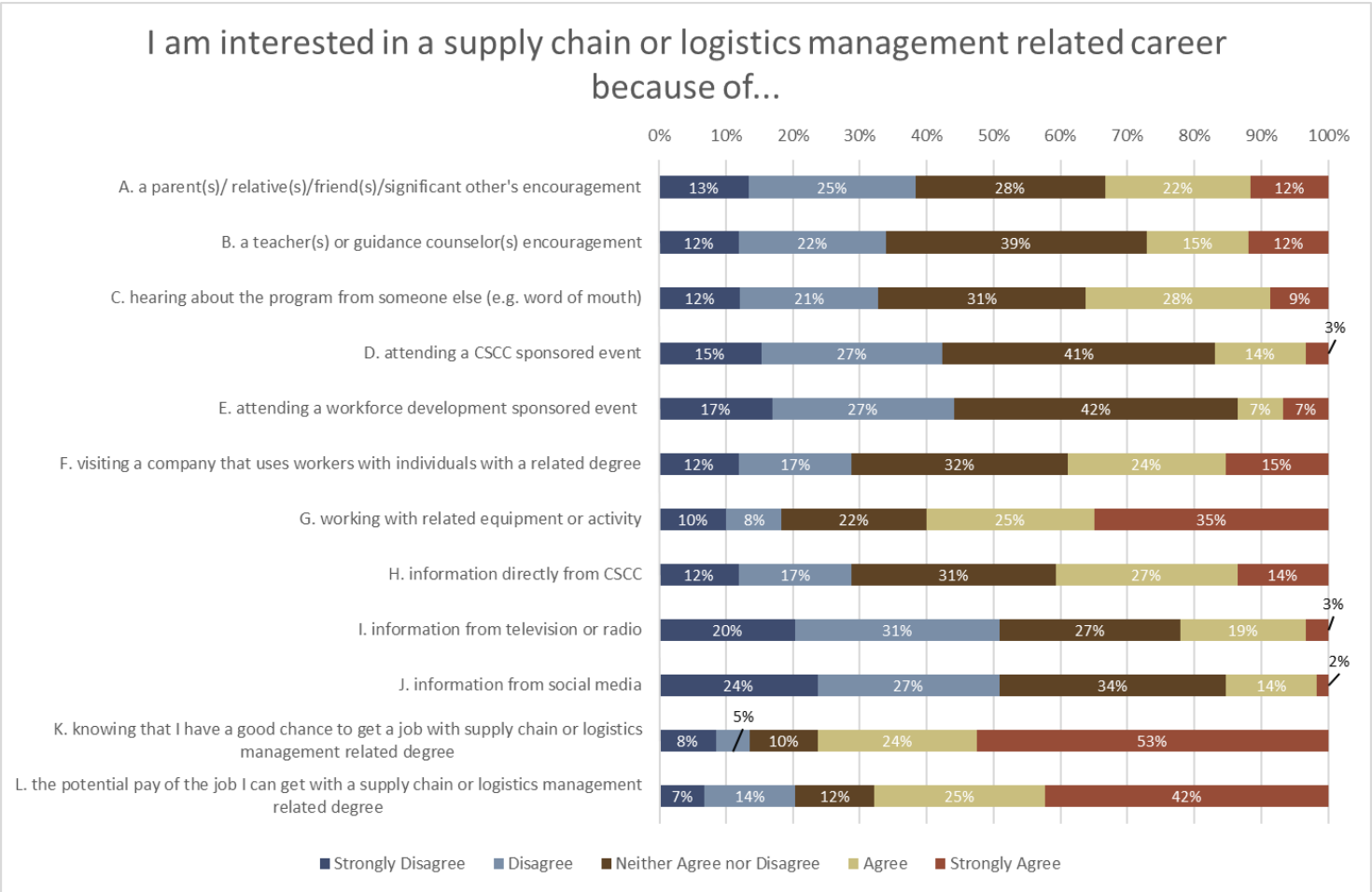
## **Key Highlights.**

In total, 66 students completed the survey, of which 75% plan to pursue a LET related pathway. Additionally:

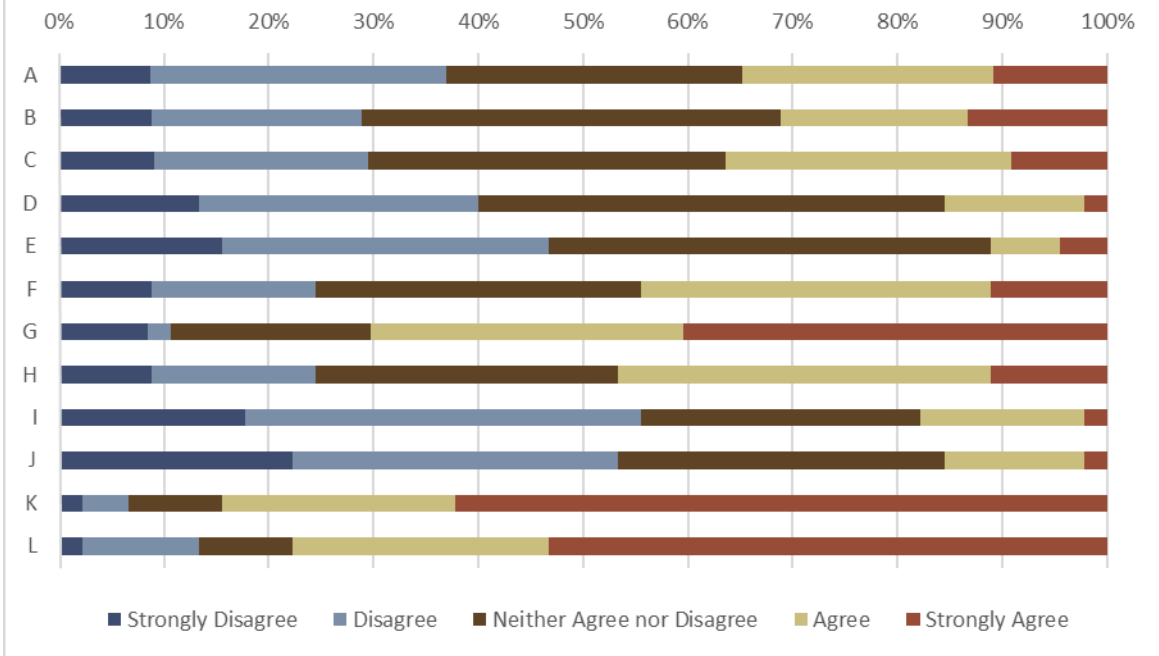
- Students who plan on pursuing LET or a related major tend to agree more strongly with the job prospects of a related career than students who do not intend to pursue the field.
- While most students didn't report changes in self-efficacy from the beginning to the end of the term, about 1/3 of students across self-efficacy items did indicate increased self-efficacy. This change seemed to be particularly pronounced for students planning compared to those not planning to pursue LET or a related major as an area of study.



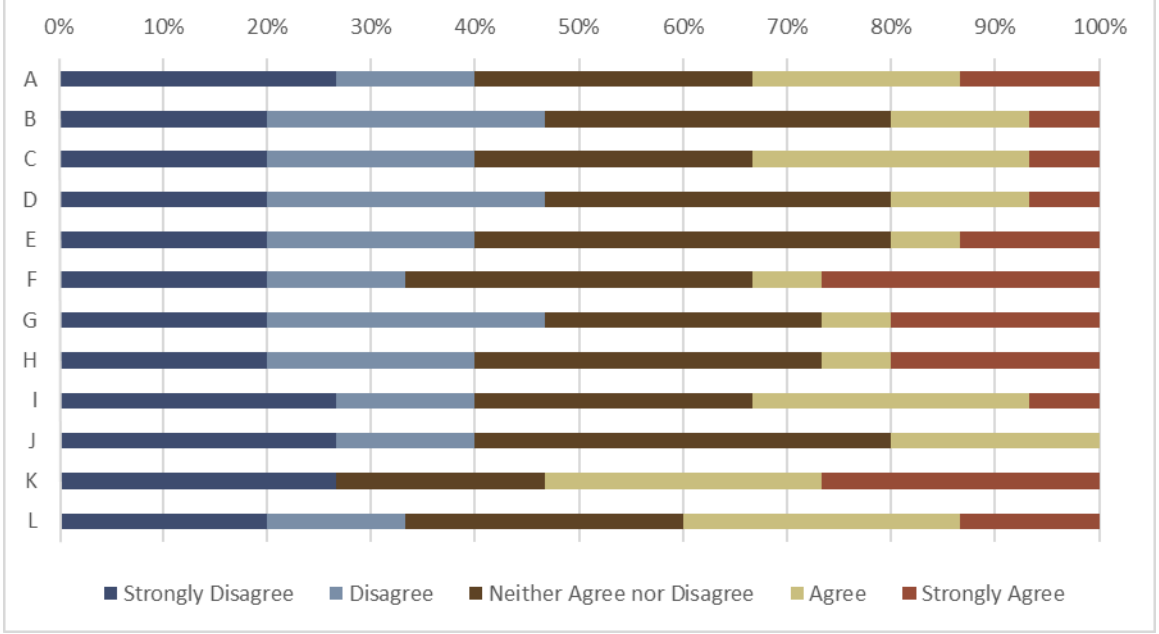

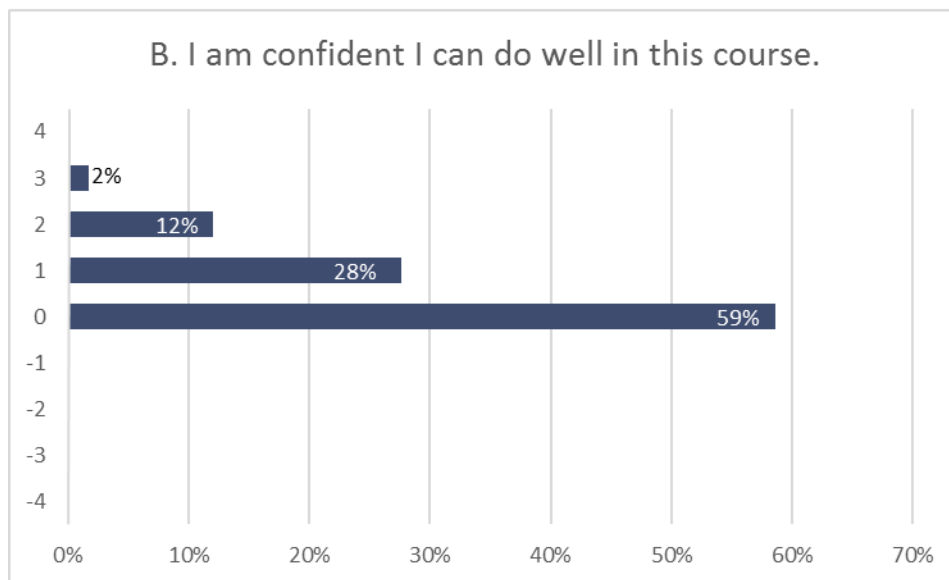
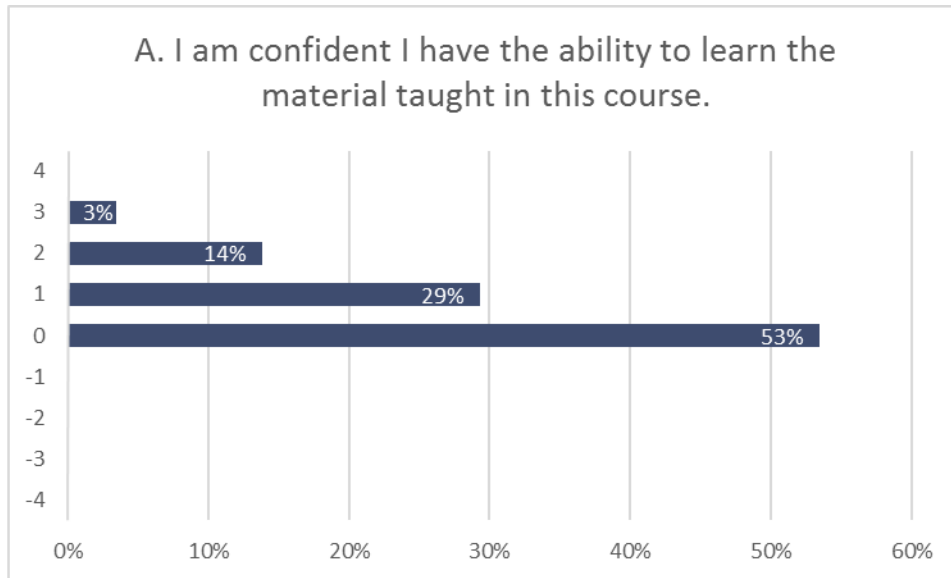
Question 2 - Currently/Planning on majoring in supply chain or logistics management related career

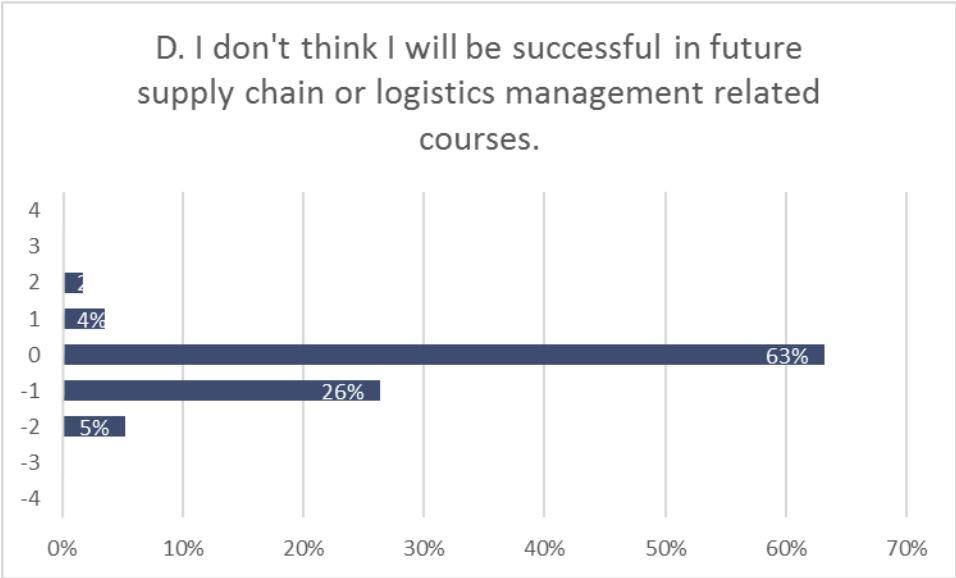
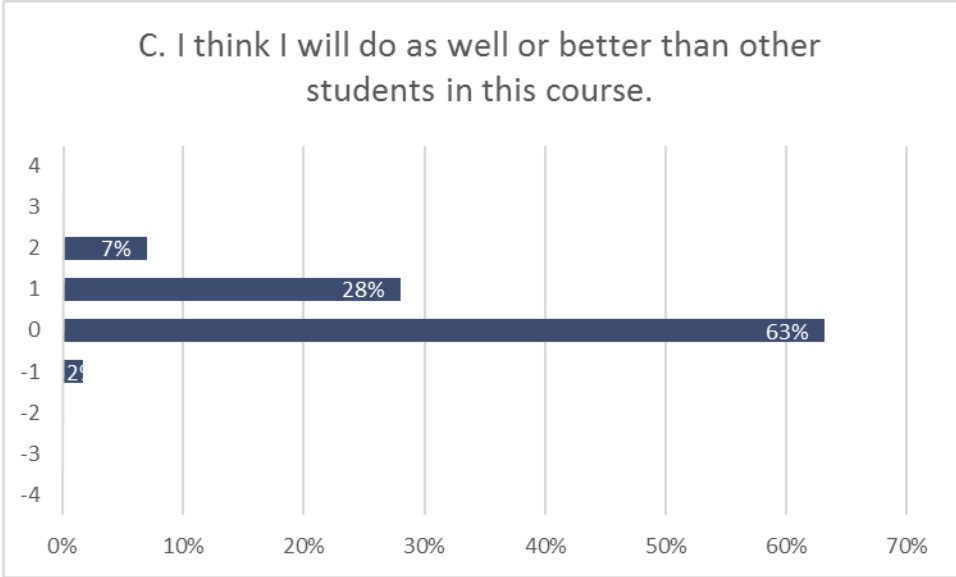


Question 2 - NOT planning on majoring in supply chain or logistics management related career



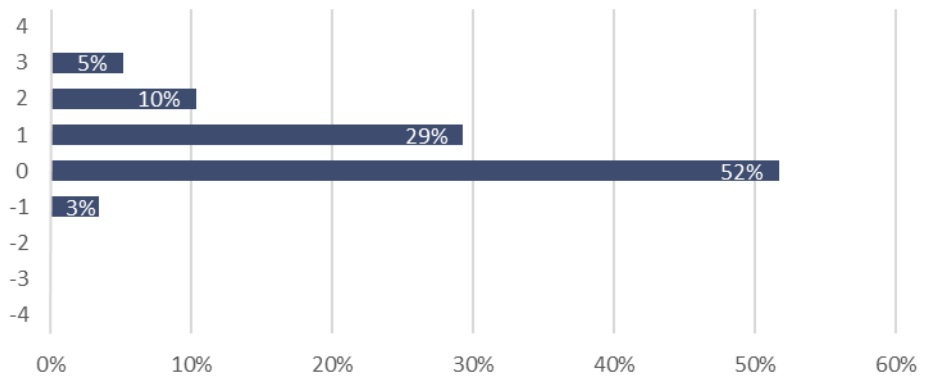
**Counterfactual Survey Results.** For items A—B, students were asked to consider each statement, **before** completing a supply chain or logistics management related course and **afterwards**. We calculated a change score such that, if a positive number is reported, then they more strongly agreed with the statement after completing the course than before; if a negative number is reported they less strongly agree with the statement afterwards than before. And a zero, represents no change.



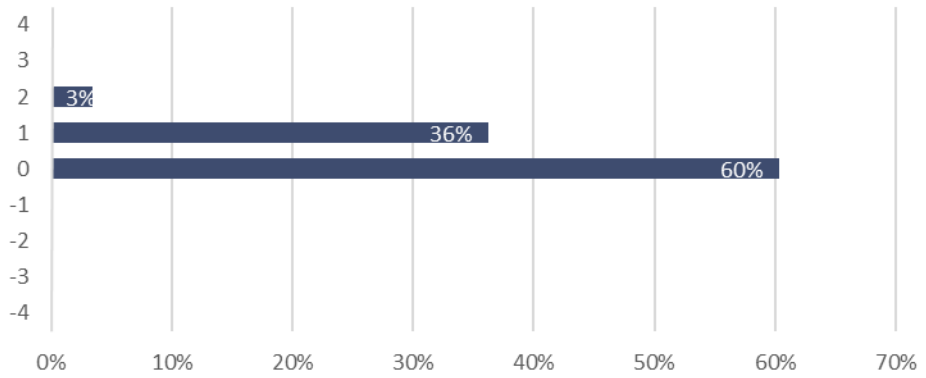

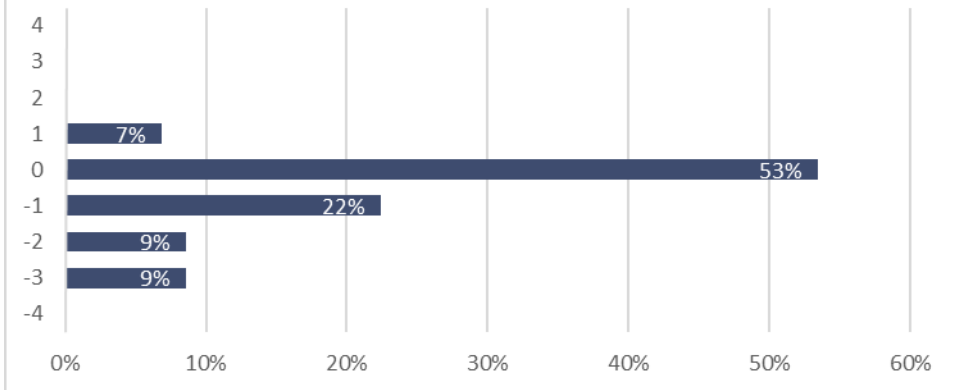


F. I believe that if I exert enough effort, I will be successful in supply chain or logistics management related courses.



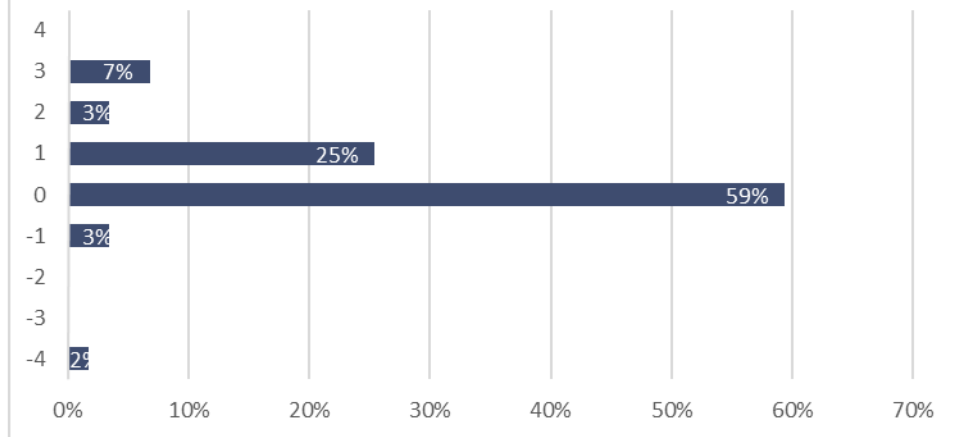


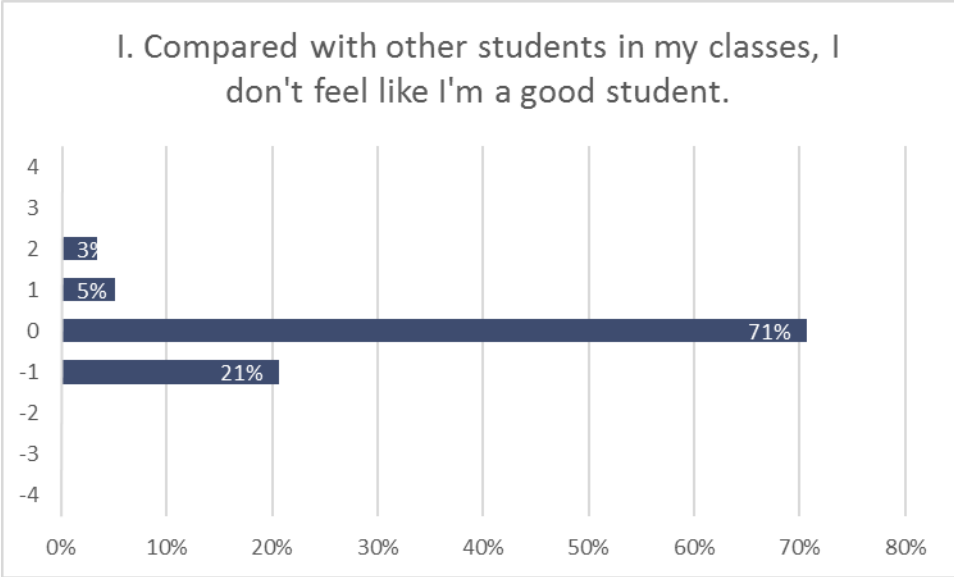
G. I feel like I don't know a lot about supply chain or logistics management compared to other students in my classes.



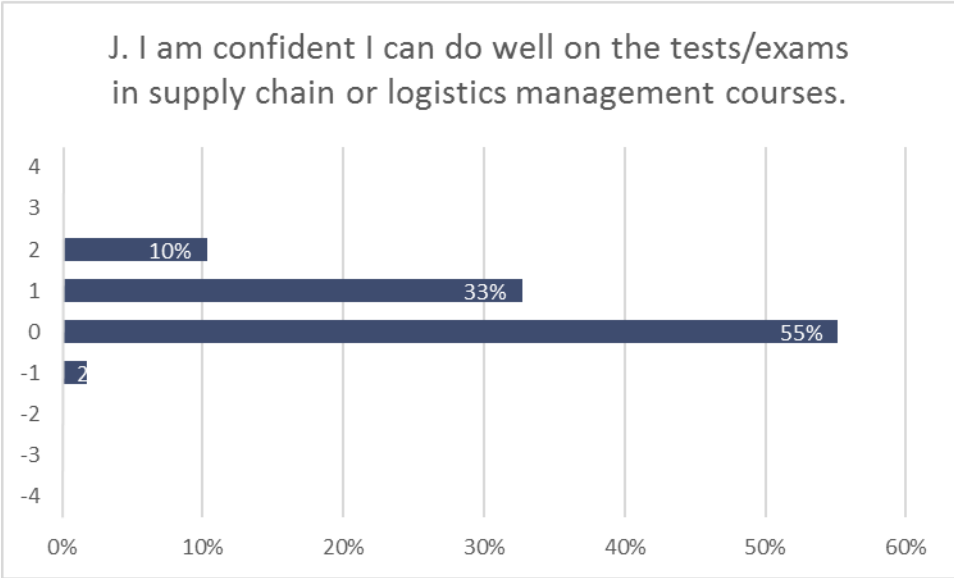

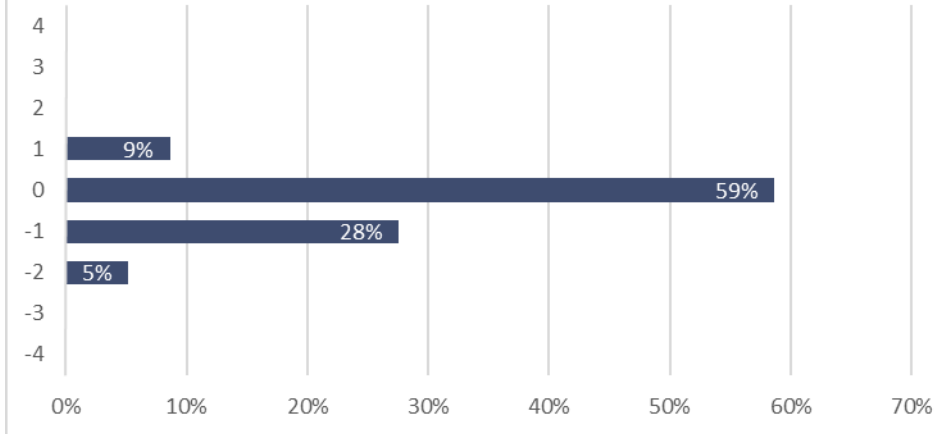




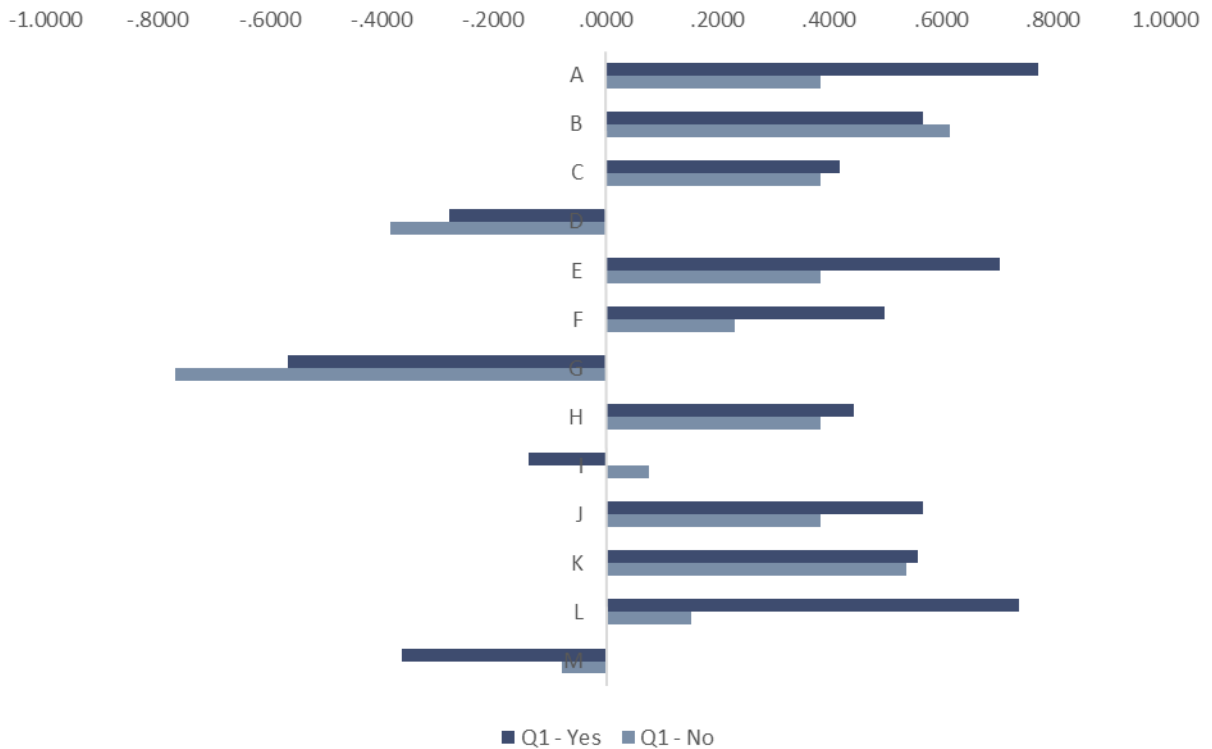

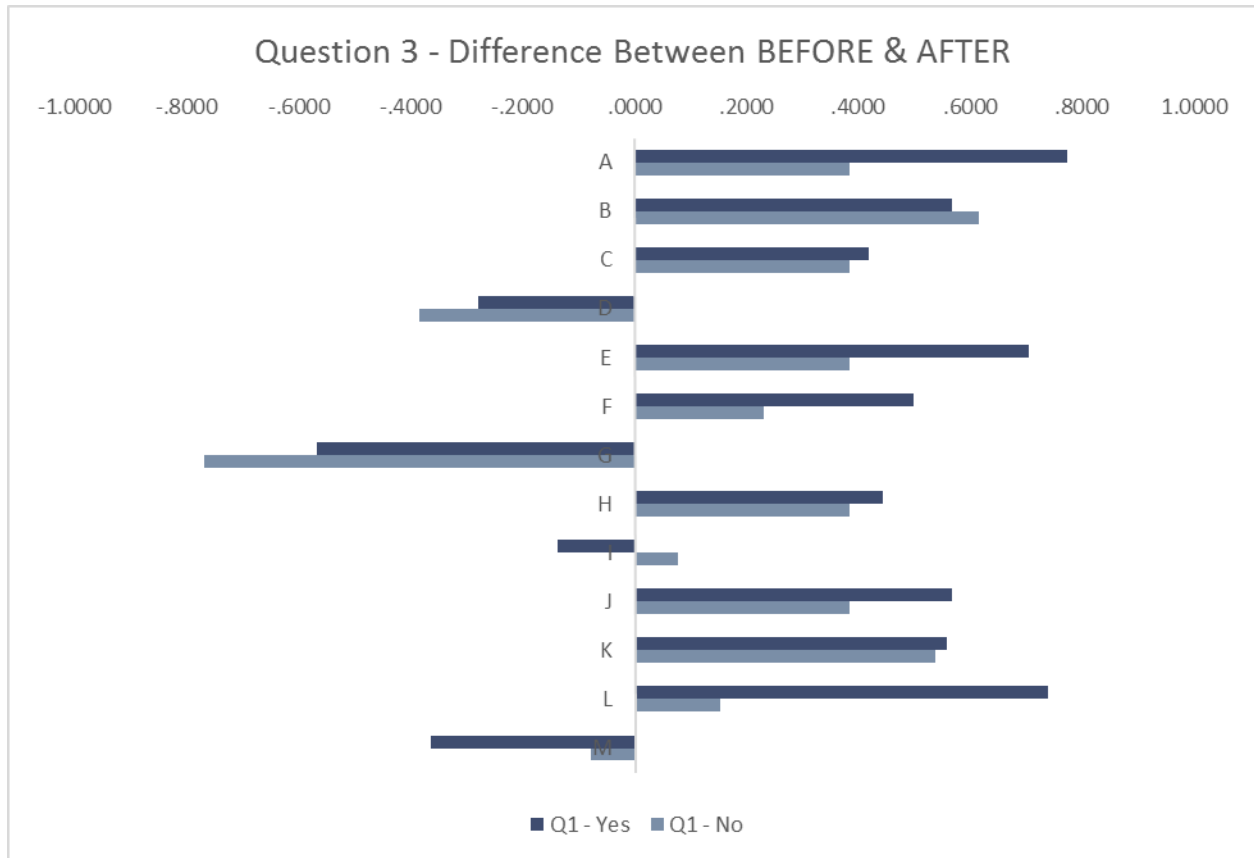

**Item #1: What do you believe is a major reason for not completing a supply chain or logistics management related major? What support would you need to overcome that reason? (Page 13 - 15)**

- A lack of commitment and or effort. You need to do the work in a timely fashion, along with reading and understanding the associated material that goes with this degree.
- A lack of information in what careers this would open up. I think support could involve giving more information about what the degree could lead to in the start of classes related to it would help.
- A major reason someone might not complete the major may be lack of interest in the subject. It can be very dry sometimes. To overcome this, different learning activities that engage the student might be more productive and hold the students attention.
- Accounting is tough and some people are not math people and that is obviously a required course.
- Could be that many of the classes for a SCM degree do not overlap with other degree programs. Accounting, Finance, and Business tend to have many of the same core classes so students are able to flip/flop or switch and not have to take a whole bunch of new classes in order to graduate.
